DURHAM — The Ontario government is providing three non-profit organizations in Durham Riding with \$234,100 in funding this year through the Ontario Trillium Foundation's (OTF) Capital grant stream to make it easier for residents to access the critical programming, activities and spaces that make Durham a great place to live, work and play.

"Organizations like Autism Home Base, Bethesda House, and Big Brothers Big Sisters of North Durham are more than just services - they are lifelines in our community," said Todd McCarthy, MPP for Durham. "This financial support will ensure these vital institutions can continue enriching the lives of residents across Durham for years to come."

OTF's Capital grant stream helps organizations improve their infrastructure so they can continue delivering programs and services that Ontarians need to thrive. Whether it's purchasing equipment, building a new space or completing renovations, retrofits or repairs, these grants support projects that are making a difference in Durham.

In Durham Riding, organizations receiving funding include Autism Home Base, Bethesda House, and Big Brothers Big Sisters of North Durham.

These Capital grants are part of the more than \$28 million supporting 291 local programs and services that help deliver critical community programming across province.

"Across Ontario, non-profit organizations are delivering critical programming that is helping people train for new careers, stay active, learn new things and connect with their community," said Stan Cho, Minister of Tourism, Culture and Gaming. "That's why capital grant support is so important. This funding will help ensure facilities and spaces are accessible, modern and central to communities across our province."
